How do we stop this happening – take away the Green vote in the Senate. The Senate is where the Labor party will need the Green preferences to get legislation through. In a perfect world either of the 2 preferred parties

would govern in their own right, but they must have the numbers in the senate as well.

This election is shaping up as the Greens holding the balance of power in the senate and may hinder either of the major parties governing without doing a deal.

If we can get a few other senators up we can limit the Greens influence. In this election we are not telling you who to vote for in the House of Representatives, just asking you not to vote for the Greens in the Senate. I would rather have a group of independent or other party

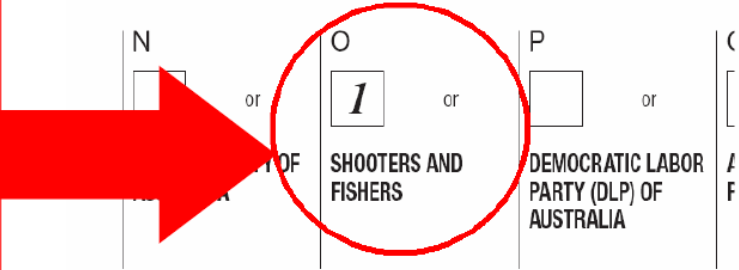
